

Access to treatment/recovery groups

Make training more accessible

- Learn what training is out there and who can access it
- What are the gaps
- Develop a strategic plan
- Create List of quick solutions

Collaborate with Department of Education

- Provide SUD training materials to school counselors
- Provide evidence-based practices to cover students/parents/etc.

Increase advertisement around SUD treatment and recovery

- Tap into DAODAS state wide media campaign

Safer Prescribing and Education

- Want to Align with SCMA to help codevelop continuing medical education classes (CME)
 - There is a large need for SBIRT and chronic pain management trainings

Safe storage and Elimination

- Work with EPA for mobile incinerators
- Work to educate pediatricians on the practices of safe storage so they can convey the message to parents
- Educate assisted living facilities about safe storage
- Increase the number of drop boxes throughout the state
